Visitor Information re. Eastbourne International Tennis (3 June to 8 July 2024)

The Eastbourne International Tennis Tournament is a major annual event which takes place in Devonshire Park. Towner is situated in the centre of the site. The 2024 tournament dates are 22 to 29 June, but site preparations mean there are car parking and access restrictions in this area from 3 June until 8 July. Towner remains open during this period and in fact our restaurant offers an excellent vantage point over the courts. The following information is to provide you with as much information as possible so you can plan ahead to ensure a smooth visit.

Key Dates:

3 June to 8 July: Car Park and Road closures
22 June to 29 June: Tournament Dates (bag searches into Towner and designated entry route)

Entrance Route to Towner:

From **22 June to 30 June**, the only access route to Towner will be via GATE 2, which is accessed from Compton Street and then onto the front plaza area, walking towards the Congress Theatre and then left along the front of Congress Theatre to our main entrance. In case of any queues, please let event stewards know that you are visiting Towner only (not Tennis) and you will be fast tracked. Please refer to the site map below which shows the route via GATE 2 into Towner from Compton Street. Arriving at Towner all bags will be searched on entry so please try to keep bags to a minimum and do not carry any restricted items. [SITE MAP HERE](#).

Car Park/Road Closures

Due to Tennis the following closures will in place from 3 June to 8 July:
College Road & Devonshire Park Pay and Display Car Parks (both closed)
College Road itself is closed to vehicles.
Blackwater Road and Hardwick Rd are also closed for on street parking.

Blue Badge Spaces:

Please note the car park closures indicated above, which will include the disabled bays in these car parks.

The 30 min blue badge drop off area alongside the plaza in front of Towner will not be available from c. 19 June to 7 July. The blue badge parking bays alongside the plaza will remain in use, but likely to be much in demand.

In Eastbourne, blue badge holders can park:
in designated blue badge parking bays up to the maximum stay permitted
in shared use bays or pay and display bays without time limit or payment
for up to three hours on a single or double yellow line with the clock set to show the time of arrival, and where loading restrictions are not in force.
